2nd Week of June: Let's be warriors working together with God (1 Chronicles 11:10-19)

Welcome

Let's share a story of joy experienced while working together. Also, let's share one of the blessings received through Grace Time last week.

Text: Chronicles 11:10-19

Introduction

God is the Almighty Jehovah, but He does not work alone. He works through people. When He built the ark, when He led the Exodus, and when He destroyed the walls of Jericho, He worked with God's people who obeyed His word. Jesus also selected 12 apostles to establish His church and trained them for three years. After working with them for three years, He entrusted them with world missions when He ascended to heaven. And He promised that He would be with His disciples until the end of the world through the Holy Spirit. In today's message, God worked through David when He established His kingdom. Even though David was anointed by God as king, the kingdom was not established by his own strength. He appointed people to help David and work with him.

(1 Chronicles 11:10) These were the ones who helped David and strengthened his kingdom, according to the word of the Lord.

After 43 years of the founding of the church, it is time to gather our hearts again. We have a ministry to walk together before us. Let us stand again before the calling of God who wants to establish His kingdom through today's message.

■ Observation Question: Let's examine the records of David's warriors who helped David establish Israel today and see how we can build God's kingdom together.

Answer 1.David's warriors were brave men. (1 Chronicles 11:11-14)

The most courageous warriors among the 30 were Jashobeam, Eleazar, and Shammah. Just as David killed Goliath with a millstone, the fact that these three men alone faced the army and won was not because of their great fighting skills. The Lord was with them. In other words, the Lord's Holy Spirit worked when He saw their faith. Since these warriors possessed the same faith as David, the Holy Spirit worked in the same way. Like David, they had the simple belief that when they went out in the name of the Lord, victory in battle did not come from the number of troops or equipment, but from the Lord. So, like David, they faced the battle with such faith, and the Lord worked. The people God uses are people of faith, even if they do not have much knowledge, skills, or outstanding personalities. Joshua 1:6,7,9 Be strong and courageous. But I have commanded you to be strong and very courageous. Do not be afraid or discouraged, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go.

Answer 2. David's warriors were loyal. (1 Chronicles 11:15-19)

The war with the Philistines took place near David's hometown of Bethlehem. While staying in the fortress, David looked down at his hometown of Bethlehem from afar. And he desperately wanted to drink just a sip of water from the well near the gate. It was harvest time. The weather was extremely hot, his body was tired from the war, and above all, there was no water to drink in the mountains. David said casually, "Would someone please bring me some water from the well near the gate of Bethlehem. wish I could drink just a sip!" This was not an order. It was just a sigh of longing for his hometown, mixed with a desire. However, the three warriors who heard this-Jashobeam, Eleazar, and Shammah-headed straight toward the enemy camp. Bethlehem had already been occupied by the Philistine army. They were deep in the enemy camp, where arrows were flying and swords were flashing. However, the three warriors risked their lives to draw water from the well near the gate and bring it to David. David did not drink the water, but poured it out before the Lord, saying, "This water is not water, but the blood and lives of those who went forward without regard for their own lives. David could not drink this water. Their devotion was more than self-serving. They were not simply loyal to the king, but loyal to God. These three men did not simply listen to the words of their leader. They read God's heart in those words. Their loyalty ultimately became God's glory. 1 Corinthians 4:1-2 Let a man so regard us, as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God. And it is required of stewards that they be found faithful



2) What should we be trained to become a loyal warrior?

Answer 3. David's warriors were people raised by the Lord

These warriors in Chapter 11 of the Chronicles were not people who appeared all at once or in an instant. They were people who gathered together when David was hiding in the cave of Adullam.

(1 Chronicles 11:1) So David left and fled to the cave of Adullam. When his brothers and all his father's house heard about it, they went down to him.

About 400 men came out to David, but they were not strong warriors from the beginning.

(1 Chronicles 11:2) All who were in distress, all who were in debt, and all who were discontented gathered to him, and he became their commander. There were about 400 men with him.

In other words, these are people who suffered under King Saul and who, upon hearing that God would make David king, turned their backs on everything and came out to David. In a way, they risked their lives. These are people whose hearts were touched by the Holy Spirit. One example is a man named Amasai. (1 Kings 12:18) Then the Spirit came upon Amasai, the leader of the thirty, and he said, "We will be yours, David, and we will be with you, son of Jesse. Peace be with you. Peace be with you, and peace with your helpers, for your God helps you." So David received them and made them commanders of the army. In addition, David's warriors came from among the Gentiles. As they gathered around David, God began to gradually make them into warriors of God. David was not the only one who was trained while being pursued by Saul. The warriors who were with David also lived in tension, relying on the Lord like David. You are the warriors of the cave of Adullam. The Lord has led you to the Church of Grace. And during that time, the Lord has trained you in various departments, ministries, and mission fields through the process of nurturing you. You have grown as spiritual soldiers. Just as God raised up the 400 people in Adullam and used them greatly for His kingdom. He will use you for world missions.
