3rd Week of June: What Believers Must Overcome to Gain Victory (1 Chronicles 17:8)

■ Welcome

Let's share any memorable victories or comeback stories that stand out to you. Also, let's share one of the blessings received through Grace Time last week.

■ Text: 1 Chronicles 17:8

"I have been with you wherever you have gone, and I have cut off all your enemies from before you. Now I will make your name like the names of the greatest men on earth."

■ Introduction

David achieved remarkable victories in every battle he fought. His enemies were not just one nation but all the surrounding nations. Yet, he never experienced a stalemate; he triumphed in every conflict. The secret to David's success was the covenant God gave him — a promise, as seen in today's passage, that He would destroy David's enemies (2 Samuel 7:1-17).

While David's victories were grounded in the covenant God made with him, this same covenant has been extended to all believers who are in Christ. This is because Christ Jesus is the descendant of David, the One who sits on David's throne, reigning as the Messiah and King of Israel. In particular, Jesus triumphed over sin and death through His resurrection, and now holds all authority in heaven and on earth.

(Revelation 3:7) "To the angel of the church in Philadelphia write: These are the words of Him who is holy and true, who holds the key of David. What He opens no one can shut, and what He shuts no one can open."

Even now, like the believers in the church of Philadelphia, we can hold firmly to this covenant of victory found in Jesus — whether in ministry, business, academics, or any aspect of life. This is an astounding promise: because we are in Jesus, who holds the promise of David's victories, we too are guaranteed triumph. We have already been promised victory in Christ — even before the battles begin.

■ Observation Question: What kind of victory is guaranteed to us in Christ Jesus?

Answer 1. Believers overcome the world through Christ.

(1 John 5:4-5) "<u>For everyone born of God overcomes the world</u>. This is the victory that has overcome the world, even our faith. Who is it that overcomes the world? <u>Only the</u> one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God."

The phrase "born of God" refers to those who have experienced spiritual rebirth or regeneration — true believers. Because they are born of God, believers are given the strength to resist and overcome the world. This power comes from the indwelling Spirit of God and the presence of His life within them. So, what does "the world" mean in this context? The term kosmos refers to worldly attitudes and values that oppose God — the domain of darkness ruled by the devil and the sinful, self-centered systems of this age. It includes "the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life."

(Acts 4:26) "The kings of the earth rise up and the rulers band together against the Lord and against His Anointed One."

This world, including the religious leaders of the Jews, persecuted and condemned Jesus, ultimately betraying Him through Judas and having Him crucified by Roman authorities. Yet, Jesus did not compromise with or fear the suffering and persecution brought on by the world. Instead, He endured the cross and fulfilled the will of the Father.

(John 16:33) "In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world."

Now, as believers, we participate in the victory that Christ has already secured. This allows us to live as overcomers in the midst of the world. Therefore, when we face trials and tribulations, we do not need to be discouraged or fall into despair — we can be bold and confident, because the One who overcame the world is with us. To "believe that Jesus is the Son of God" means to acknowledge His full divinity and humanity. Those who believe that Jesus is the Messiah have already been given the power to overcome the world.

Application Question 1

Let's share testimonies of how we have experienced victory by believing in Jesus and proclaiming His victorious name in faith. (If there is something you are currently proclaiming in faith, let's share it together and pray.)

Answer 2. Believers overcome the devil through Christ.

(James 4:7) "Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you."

The word "flee" is not used here as a mere possibility or suggestion in the future tense—it is a promise of certainty. If we resist the devil, he will flee. The world we live in is ruled by the devil, who uses his spiritual forces to oppose God's kingdom and torment His people. The devil often attacks believers not openly, but through cunning—using worldly desires, pride, envy, and other fleshly weaknesses as entry points. That is why, before telling us to resist the devil, the Apostle James first commands us to repent thoroughly of fleshly and worldly desires.

(James 4:4) "You adulterous people, don't you know that friendship with the world means enmity against God? Therefore, anyone who chooses to be a friend of the world becomes an enemy of God."

Submitting to God is the only way believers can truly stand against the devil in spiritual warfare. Before we can stand against the devil, we must first kneel before God. Then we will be empowered to resist and overcome.

By clinging daily to Jesus—who has already conquered the devil—and by living a life filled with prayer, the Word, and obedience to Christ, we can overcome the devil's influence and walk in continual victory.

Application Question 2

- 1) What do I need to surrender first in order to submit to the Lord and His Word?
- 2) In which area of your life do you want to pray and make declarations in the name of Jesus?

Answer 3. Believers overcome death through Christ.

(1 Corinthians 15:55) "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?"

The Apostle Paul taunts death as a defeated enemy, boldly proclaiming that death's power and sting have been decisively nullified. This is a triumphant declaration of death's complete powerlessness. The fear that once bound humanity—death—can no longer terrify us. When a believer finishes their labor on earth and leaves the body, they are brought into the presence of the Lord, where they will live forever in rest and glory, in their true eternal home.

Here are some final words of great Christians who embraced this victory:

- William Gadsby: "I shall soon be with Him—victory, victory, victory!" (Then lifting his hand) "Forever"
- Adoniram Judson, missionary to Burma: "I go with the joy of a schoolboy bounding out of school. I feel so strong in Christ."
- Martin Luther: "Into Your hands I commend my spirit. You have redeemed me, O God of truth."

Now, believers are victorious in Jesus and will one day receive their eternal reward in heaven.

(Revelation 3:21) "To the one who is victorious, I will give the right to sit with Me on My throne, just as I was victorious and sat down with My Father on His throne."
