1st Week of June: The Message the First Chapter of the Bible Gives to Modern People(Genesis 1:1)

■ Welcome

During the past week, was there a moment when you felt that God was taking care of you? Let's also share one thing you received through last week's Grace Time.

■ Text: Genesis 1:1

“In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.”

■ Introduction

Throughout history, people sought answers to questions such as: “Who am I?”, “What is my purpose in life?”, and “Where do I go when I die?” They repeatedly ask these questions and develop their own worldview and philosophy of life. From that worldview comes a person's values, which in turn shape both their present and future.

However, Christians who believe in Jesus go through a process of transforming their previously learned worldly values into a biblical perspective after encountering Christ.

An important part of that transformation is Genesis chapter 1. Genesis 1 answers fundamental questions such as: “How did the world come into existence?”, “How were human beings created?”, “Why do we exist?”, and “What happens after death?”

Many Christians in the 21st century do not believe the events of Genesis 1 literally. They view its contents not as actual historical events but as legends or allegories. This is often because, before becoming believers, they learned various theories in schools and society as truth.

Looking at church history, disbelief in the Creator has, since the 19th century, contributed to the weakening of many Christians and churches, causing churches to become more worldly. As a result, many ceased believing in the supernatural events described throughout the Bible—from Genesis to Revelation—and even questioned the authority of Scripture itself.

As we examine the account of creation in Genesis 1, let us review the foundational truths of our faith

■ Observation Question: What message does the first chapter of the Bible give to modern people?

Answer 1. Genesis 1 Shows That God Created the Universe and Everything in It



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The creation account in Genesis 1 teaches that all things did not come into existence on their own or by chance, but were directly created by God.

The Hebrew word for “create” (bara) means “**to bring something into existence out of nothing,**” something only God can do. Therefore, Genesis 1 teaches that everything God created has a definite beginning.

However, atheists who deny the existence of God do not accept that the world—and even humanity—is God’s creation. In schools, **the Big Bang Theory** is commonly taught regarding the origin of the earth and universe. According to this theory, all matter and energy originated from a massive explosion approximately 13.8 billion years ago, eventually forming the universe as we know it today, with the earth forming around 4.5 billion years ago.

This view is presented here as being contrary to the account in Genesis 1.

Additionally, after **Charles Darwin’s On the Origin of Species** was published in the 19th century, the emergence of life was commonly explained through evolution from simple cells to complex organisms. The passage argues that advances in scientific fields such as DNA research have caused some scientists to question these explanations.

According to Genesis 1, the universe, stars, earth, and humanity were all created by God.

✿ Application Question 1

1) Is the standard by which I live based on God’s Word, or on the values and opinions of the world around me?

Answer 2. Genesis 1 Reveals the Triune God.

The Hebrew word translated “God” in Genesis 1:1 is Elohim, which is grammatically plural. However, the verb “created” (bara) is singular. Rather than using a plural verb, the text uses a singular verb with a plural noun, presenting God as one God.

Furthermore, in verse 2, the Spirit of God appears in the creation account:

“Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters.”

In verse 3, God the Son—the Word—creates through His spoken word:

John 1:1: “In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.”

In verse 26, God again speaks of Himself in the plural:

“Let us make mankind in our image, in our likeness...”

The work of creation involved God the Father, God the Son (the Word), and God the Holy Spirit. The God revealed in Scripture is the Triune God.

✿ Application Question 2

1) Just as the Holy Spirit was active in creation, can you share a time when you sensed the Holy Spirit’s guidance in your life?



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Answer 3. Genesis 1 Shows Who I Am and How I Should Live.

1) Who Are Human Beings? — Human Identity

“So God created mankind in his own image...” (Genesis 1:27)

Human beings were created in God’s image, possessing a spirit, language, and the ability to think and reason.

2) How Should Human Beings Live? — Human Purpose

(a) We Should Live According to God’s Word

God gave humanity a standard for living. He commanded that they could eat from every tree except the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

God did not create humans as robots. Instead, He gave them free will so that they could willingly submit to the authority of their Creator and His Word.

(b) We Should Live According to Our Calling

“Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the earth and subdue it. Rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky and over every living creature that moves on the ground.” (Genesis 1:28)

The mission given to humanity is to fill the earth, subdue it, and exercise stewardship over it. Human beings are called to spread throughout the world and establish God’s kingdom through the abilities and authority He has given them.

✿ Application Question 3

1) Do I feel that I am currently living according to the mission God has given me, or do I feel that I still do not clearly understand that mission?

Answer 4. Genesis 1 Reveals God’s Love.

God is not a distant Creator who made the world and then remained far away. Rather, He is the God who seeks out each person, even on a small planet within the vast universe.

Psalms 8:3-4: “When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, what is mankind that you are mindful of them, human beings that you care for them?”

God created the heavens and the earth in six days and created humanity. The world did not come into existence by accident; God personally created it. He governs and sustains all things. Even the universe itself can be understood as an expression of God’s love for humanity.

Furthermore, when humanity sinned in Genesis 3, God promised to send the offspring of the woman to save mankind. He ultimately fulfilled that promise by sending His Son, Jesus Christ, to earth, sacrificing Him on the cross, and redeeming us.

Therefore, our value is found in the love of God, who knew us before we were born, called us, redeemed us, and adopted us as His children.

✿ Application Question 4

1) In what area of your life do you most need reassurance of God’s love right now?
