Second Week of June: Let Us Be Led by the Holy Spirit (Acts 16:11-18)

■ Welcome

What has been occupying your heart and mind the most lately? (Worries, busy responsibilities, things you enjoy, or anything else.) Let's also share one thing you received through last week's Grace Time.

■ Text: Acts 16:11-18

■ Introduction

Although people may think they are living independently, the truth is that everyone is influenced or controlled by something. Some are driven by money. Others are held captive by past wounds. Still others are led by their desires. Yet there are those who are led by the Holy Spirit.

In today's passage, we encounter two women. One was a slave girl possessed by a spirit of divination, and the other was Lydia. Though they lived in the same era, their lives turned out very differently because of whom—or what—they were following.

The Bible describes the slave girl as “a female slave who had a spirit by which she predicted the future” (Acts 16:16). Spiritually speaking, fortune-telling represents bondage to the powers of darkness. Even today, many people are captivated by superstition, worldly influences, and spiritual darkness.

In contrast, Lydia was a successful merchant dealing in purple cloth, but she did not pursue worldly satisfaction alone. She listened carefully to the message preached by the Apostle Paul, and ultimately came to faith in Jesus Christ.

(Acts 16:14) **“One of those listening was a woman from the city of Thyatira named Lydia, a dealer in purple cloth. She was a worshiper of God. The Lord opened her heart to respond to Paul's message.”**

When God opened the door for the gospel to enter Europe, He did not begin with a ruler or a great city. Instead, He used one person whose heart was open to Him—Lydia. A life surrendered to God became a channel of blessing that impacted both a household and an entire generation.

Likewise, our lives are profoundly shaped by whatever holds our hearts. What has been leading your life recently? May we not be carried along by the currents of this world, but rather be guided by God's Word and led by the Holy Spirit. In Jesus' name, Amen.



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■ **Observation Question: How can we recognize when we are being led by the Holy Spirit, and what does that look like?**

Answer 1. We Develop a Desire to Pray

One of the first signs of being led by the Holy Spirit is a growing desire to pray.

When the Apostle Paul found the doors to ministry in Asia closed, he prayed. God responded by giving him a vision and opening the door for mission work in Europe. Upon arriving in Philippi, Paul's first priority was to find a place of prayer. A person led by the Holy Spirit naturally seeks opportunities to pray wherever they go.

(Acts 16:1) **“On the Sabbath we went outside the city gate to the river, where we expected to find a place of prayer.”**

Even after being beaten and imprisoned in Philippi, Paul continued to pray and sing praises to God. Those who are led by the Holy Spirit do not pray only when circumstances are favorable; they pray regardless of their situation. That is why God's power and miracles are often revealed through prayer.

Scripture teaches us to **“pray without ceasing”** (1 Thessalonians 5:17) and to **“pray in the Spirit on all occasions”** (Ephesians 6:18). Spirit-filled believers do not limit prayer to designated times. Prayer becomes a natural part of everyday life—while working, driving, or going about daily routines—because their hearts remain connected to God.

When Paul prayed and praised God in prison, the Lord sent an earthquake and brought salvation to the jailer and his household. A life led by the Holy Spirit is a life that prays and is not controlled by circumstances.

✿ Application Question 1

1) Honestly, is your prayer life vibrant these days, or does prayer feel more like an obligation?

Answer 2. We Develop a Desire to Share Jesus

When people are filled with the Holy Spirit, they naturally become witnesses for Christ. While searching for a place of prayer in Philippi, Paul met a group of women gathered by the river and shared the gospel with them. Among them was Lydia.

Do you have a desire to share the gospel? Those who are led by the Holy Spirit begin to see people through God's eyes. They wonder whether others know Jesus and feel compelled to share the good news. This is not merely human enthusiasm—it is the work of the Holy Spirit within the heart.

When the gospel is proclaimed, the Holy Spirit works even in the lives of people who seem unlikely to change. One evidence of the Spirit's work is a growing passion to speak about Jesus. As we testify about Christ, the authority of His name is revealed.



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Just as Paul commanded the spirit to leave the slave girl in the name of Jesus and it departed, the name of Jesus still carries authority today.

(Mark 16:17) **“And these signs will accompany those who believe: In my name they will drive out demons.”**

When we are led by the Holy Spirit, the authority of Jesus' name becomes evident, and our hearts become burdened for lost souls. The passion for evangelism we experienced when we first came to faith should not fade over time. If our desire to share the gospel has diminished, it may be necessary to examine whether our hearts have become distracted by worldly concerns. As believers, we are called to live increasingly in the power and authority of Jesus Christ.

✿ Application Question 2

1) Is there someone in your life with whom you would like to share the gospel? What practical step can you take this week to act on your desire to introduce that person to Jesus?

Answer 3. We Become Captivated by God's Calling

People who live merely for survival view everything they do as a means of making a living. However, those who live with a sense of calling believe that God has entrusted them with a purpose.

The work itself may be the same, but the perspective is different. Living only for survival often leads to exhaustion and discouragement. Living for God's calling gives life meaning, direction, and purpose.

Therefore, we should ask ourselves: Am I living merely to survive, or am I living to fulfill God's purpose? After Lydia received the gospel, she opened her home to Paul and his companions and became an important supporter of the ministry that helped establish the gospel in Europe.

(Acts 16:15) **“When she and the members of her household were baptized, she invited us to her home.”**

Paul endured beatings, imprisonment, and countless hardships while preaching the gospel. Yet he remained faithful because he was captivated by God's calling.

(Acts 20:23-24) **“The Holy Spirit warns me that prison and hardships are facing me. However, I consider my life worth nothing to me; my only aim is to finish the race and complete the task the Lord Jesus has given me.”**

When we are filled with and led by the Holy Spirit, we begin to live with a sense of divine purpose and mission.

✿ Application Question 3

1) Is your life currently driven more by survival or by God's calling?
2) Lydia opened her home for God's work. What can you open or offer to God for His kingdom?
