## Family church worship plan 2026. 5. 3

### First Week of May: In a Shaking World, Hold Fast to the Unshakable Kingdom (Hebrews 12:28)

#### ■ Welcome

What small thing has had me on an emotional roller coaster this week? Let's also share one thing you received through last week's Grace Time.

#### ■ Text: Hebrews 12:28

Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us be grateful. Through this, let us serve God acceptably with reverence and awe,

#### ■ Introduction

We are living in an era of constant uncertainty. Economic conditions, political situations, social values—even our health and relationships, which we once trusted—can be shaken and disrupted in an instant. The Lord Himself said that in the last days, as His coming draws near, the world would be increasingly plagued by chaos, anxiety, and disasters.

(Matt. 24:6-8) **“You will hear of wars and rumors of wars, but see to it that you are not alarmed. Such things must happen, but the end is still to come. Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be famines and earthquakes in various places. All these are the beginning of birth pains.”**

Furthermore, the Bible teaches that the last days will not only be marked by physical turmoil but will also become an era of increasing spiritual and mental chaos and fear.

(2 Timothy 3:1-5) **“But mark this: There will be terrible times in the last days. 2 People will be lovers of themselves, lovers of money, boastful, proud, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy... 5 They will have a form of godliness but deny its power. Turn away from such people.”**

True peace is not the tranquility found in the absence of problems, but the peace enjoyed in the midst of a storm. Yet that peace cannot be found in the world; it is found only in the Lord.

Today's passage proclaims that there is a reality that remains unshaken even amid all the turmoil. It is the realm where the Lord reigns—the Kingdom of God. And it presents the secret to true healing and happiness that comes from that Kingdom. So, what is the secret that allows us to remain unshaken in this turbulent world, to enjoy the peace the Lord gives us, and to live happily while fulfilling our mission?

■ **Observation Question: What is the secret to living a life where we can fulfill our calling while enjoying the peace that the Lord gives?**

## Answer 1. We must possess the Kingdom of God.

“Since we have received a kingdom that cannot be shaken.”

The author of Hebrews describes the kingdom we enter and dwell in through Jesus as a kingdom that cannot be shaken. “**Unshakable**” (asalutos) means “never to be shaken, absolutely unshakable,” referring to a state in which the essence remains unchanged by any external shock.

Throughout human history, there have been almost no eras when all of humanity lived in peace without war, disaster, or suffering. That is the reality of this world where the devil reigns. Until Jesus, the Prince of Peace, comes to this earth, there is no peace in this world. However, **the Kingdom of God proclaimed to those who believe in Jesus is “asalutos”—an unshakable, eternal kingdom.**

When we receive Jesus Christ, we enter His kingdom, and that kingdom exists within us. Therefore, as long as we live under Jesus’ rule, we have peace even in the midst of the most anxious circumstances. The reason we believers do not lose heart is that we already have an unshakable kingdom within us. This peace that the Lord gives never wavers; rather, it grows, strengthens, and becomes more secure. “**Received**” means that ownership has already been transferred. We have now fully received that kingdom; we possess it and live in it. A believer is one who lives on this earth as a citizen of God’s kingdom.

### ✿ Application Question 1

- 1) What is the area of my life that is currently experiencing the most turmoil?
- 2) Honestly, when do I feel like I “possess” a “land that does not tremble” in my daily life, and conversely, when do I feel like I’m living as if I’ve forgotten about it?

## Answer 2. We must receive grace.

A literal translation of “**Let us receive grace**” means “**Let us hold on to grace; let us maintain gratitude.**” Here, “receive” does not simply mean to accept passively, but refers to a state of continually holding on to grace, maintaining it, and not letting it slip away. Furthermore, in this context, the expression can also be interpreted to mean “Let us give thanks.” This implies that those who recognize and understand grace will inevitably respond with gratitude.

### Example 1) **Stephen: Deacon of the Early Church**

While preaching the gospel, he faced the peril of a gruesome death by stoning. Yet the Bible records that at that moment, “**his face was like the face of an angel.**” Even on the brink of death, he demonstrated the pinnacle of peace by praying for forgiveness for those who were harming him.

Example 2) **Last year, during the MEGL 15 conference in Turkey, a miracle occurred**

where people received grace and were even baptized amidst an earthquake. Furthermore, during this year’s MEGL 16 conferences, a two-week ceasefire occurred during the war with Iran, allowing people from 16 nations to gather. With interpretation provided in five languages, the ministry was carried out amidst great grace. In this world full of tribulations, we must receive even greater grace and live victorious lives.

### ✿ Application Question 2

- 1) You mentioned that “receiving grace” does not mean passively accepting it, but rather actively holding onto it and not letting it slip away. If you have your own way of holding onto the grace you have received from God rather than letting it slip away, what is it?

## Answer 3. We must serve God with reverence and awe to please Him.

“**Serve God with reverence and awe to please Him.**”

This passage speaks to the children of God—who believe in the great God who is Creator, Redeemer, and Judge—about the attitude with which they should serve God, especially in the last days.

The grace we have received must not end with mere emotion but must lead to service and worship. Those who have received an unshakable kingdom will serve God in a way that pleases Him. **Godliness is our attitude before God, and reverence is a holy awe toward God.**

When circumstances shake us and make us anxious, we must remember that we are people who already possess an unshakable kingdom—one that the world cannot give and cannot take away.

Psalm 46 is the psalm Luther recited while facing death threats and persecution during the Reformation.

(Psalm 46:1-3) “**God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. 2 Therefore, though the earth be removed, and though the mountains be carried into the heart of the sea, 3 though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble at its swelling, we will not fear.**”

The world is shaking, and our circumstances are shaking. But even in the midst of it all, let us give thanks to God, who has given us His unshakable kingdom. Therefore, we must live as holy worshippers who fear God and please the Lord in our daily lives. We must possess God’s unshakable kingdom deep within our hearts and live holding fast to His grace. Ultimately, in this unstable world, we must live lives that remain unshaken, living in God’s peace to fulfill the mission He has given us—the vision of completing world missions to the ends of the earth.

### ✿ Application Question 3

- 1) Please share instances when the grace you received remained merely an emotional experience, and instances when it led to actual service and worship.
- 2) Even in the face of death, Luther clung to Psalm 46 and fulfilled his calling. What Scripture or hymn am I clinging to right now to stand firm in my place?
