### Fourth Week of March: Faith That Strengthens Weakness (Hebrews 11:32-34)

#### ■ Welcome

What image comes to mind when you think of a “person of strong faith”? Please share how God touched your heart through Grace Time this week.

#### ■ Text: Hebrews 11:32-34

32 What more shall I say? Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, David, Samuel, and the prophets—I do not have enough time to tell of all their deeds. 33 By faith they conquered kingdoms, administered justice, and received what had been promised; they shut the mouths of lions, 34 quenched the power of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, were made strong out of weakness, became mighty in battle, and put foreign armies to flight

#### ■ Introduction

Hebrews 11 is often referred to as the “Chapter of Faith.” This chapter features people of faith such as Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, David, and Samuel. When we look at these people, we tend to think of them as having exceptionally strong faith. However, if we examine the Bible closely, we see that they were not perfect people.

David committed a grave sin because he could not control his lust. Samson had so many weaknesses that it is hard to even describe them. Barak was a man who was afraid and made practical calculations. Samuel also had a weakness regarding his children. As we can see, the people of faith who appear in the Bible were all weak people.

Despite this, why does the Bible call them people of faith? It is not because they were perfect, but because they lived by faith. Faith strengthens our weaknesses. They took one step after another, beginning with small acts of faith. Those small steps accumulated to strengthen their faith. Therefore, what is important in faith is not grand events, but small acts of obedience.

Faith is not reserved for the perfect. It is given even to the weak. And that faith strengthens our weakness. Faith is God's grace that strengthens our weakness. People of faith were able to become people of strong faith because there was one thing that God accepted in them.



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■ **Observation Question: What is the one thing God accepts through faith?**

**Answer 1. God sees one thing above all our many weaknesses.**

Parents often fail to see their children’s problems clearly. Even when their children have countless flaws, they choose to overlook them and focus only on their good qualities. Surprisingly, God sees us in the same way. If God had judged us by the standard of His justice, we would already be doomed. But God looks at us through the eyes of love. Even though we have countless weaknesses, God does not focus solely on them.

“Still, that child is sincere,” “Still, that child has a heart for me.”

He sees only that one thing. That is why the mystery of faith is this: It may seem as though we believe in God, but in reality, it is God who believes in us.

### ☼ Application Question 1

- 1) Is there anyone—myself or someone around me—whom I’ve been judging too harshly lately? Why do I feel this way, and what thoughts or attitudes do I need to change within myself to let go of that judgmental perspective?
- 2) How did you feel when someone believed in and supported your “sincere intentions” instead of focusing on your mistakes or shortcomings?

**Answer 2. So, what is the one thing God acknowledges in us?**

We think we believe in God. But the deeper mystery of faith is not that we believe in God, but that God believes in us. Even amidst our countless weaknesses, God sees that one sincere heart and accepts it as faith.

What is that one thing for us? Is there something God looks at and says, “At least this much is genuine”? That is your faith. Therefore, we must not focus on our countless weaknesses and shortcomings. We must focus on that one thing that God delights in and acknowledges. Even if it is a little lacking or clumsy, God accepts it as an expression of your love for Him. We make many mistakes and have many weaknesses. But even amidst all of that, God seeks out that one thing that points to His heart.

#### \* An example from Pastor Ko Sung-jun’s church during the COVID-19 pandemic

There was a time during the pandemic when we could not hold services at the church. At that time, I witnessed an amazing scene. The church doors were closed, yet congregants came to the church, clung to the walls, and prayed while weeping. “God, please let us worship You.” Seeing that, I realized that this was the one act of faith we could offer to God. We may be lacking in many ways, but God accepts that one sincere heart as faith.



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### ☼ Application Question 2

- 1) What is it that makes me feel “weak” or “inadequate” these days, causing me to hesitate to stand before God?
- 2) Even if it may seem clumsy or insignificant to others, what is the sincere attitude or heart of mine that I believe God would acknowledge as “genuine”?

**Answer 3. There was one thing that God accepted even from people of faith.**

Even the people of faith mentioned in the Bible had their weaknesses. Yet they each possessed one thing that God accepted. And God accepted that one thing as faith.

Barack had the loyalty to stand his ground until the very end. He was a man who remained in the shadow of Deborah and spent his life as her second-in-command, yet he never abandoned his post until the very end. David had a heart devoted to worshiping God. David loved praising and worshiping God above all else. Samuel had a dedication to his calling. He held fast to his mission in both good times and bad. Samson had the courage to never back down from his enemies.

God does not seek perfect people. God already knows that we cannot be perfect. But even amidst our countless weaknesses, God seeks that one thing directed toward Him.

#### \* An example from Pastor Ko Seong-jun’s time as an international student

It is said that there was a time during his studies abroad when his ministry completely failed. As he prayed and kept confessing, “I have sinned,” God asked him, “But isn’t your love for Me genuine?” Faced with that question, the pastor confessed, “Yes, God, I have made many mistakes and failed, but my love for You is genuine.” He says that confession changed the course of his life.

All of us believers must also have that one thing that God accepts. God will accept it as your faith. And that faith will ultimately shape you into a person of faith.

### ☼ Application Question 3

- 1) Among Barak (loyalty), David (worship), Samuel (dedication), and Samson (courage), which “one thing” do you most want to emulate or relate to in your current situation?
- 2) Without focusing on my weaknesses or striving for perfection, what specific “small step (of obedience)” will I take this week to hold on to “that one thing” that pleases God? (Small steps add up to strengthen our faith.)
