3rd Week of January: Let's Make This New Year One Where We Inherit and Enjoy the Abundant Blessings of God's Kingdom (Joshua 14:6-15)

■ Welcome

Let's share our favorite Bible verse and hymn. Also, let's share one of the gracious things we received through last week's Grace Time.

■ Text: Joshua 14:6-15

■ Introduction

Our church will continue to fulfill its mission in 2026 to spread the Gospel throughout the earth, establish disciples, and plant churches.

Our faith journey is similar to the process when Joshua and the Israelites conquered the land of Canaan that God had given them. The conquest of Canaan was entirely God's work. However, God did not do everything unilaterally—Israel also participated in God's work through faith. The representative event of this is the conquest of Jericho. The walls of Jericho were not brought down by the Israelites, who had no weapons or military tactics. God himself worked before the people who obeyed His Word. Therefore, the conquest of Canaan was accomplished not through human ability, but through faith that trusted and obeyed God.

We see the same principle in today's passage. In the process of conquering the land of Canaan, Caleb is a special figure—he is a representative person who actually inherited and enjoyed God's promise. He did not lose the faith he held in his youth even into old age, and finally received the hill country of Hebron as his inheritance. Let us learn through Caleb's faith the secret to how he was able to receive blessing from God.

■ Observation Question: : How can we, like Caleb, inherit and enjoy the abundant blessings of God's kingdom that He has prepared?

Answer 1. Claim God's Promised Word

(Verse 12) “Now give me this hill country that the LORD promised me that day”

Caleb came before Joshua, recalling God's promise and requesting that the promise be fulfilled. This was the word God spoke 45 years ago at Kadesh Barnea.



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(Joshua 14:9) **"So on that day Moses swore to me, 'The land on which your feet have walked will be your inheritance and that of your children forever, because you have followed the LORD my God wholeheartedly.'"**

This word was a promise God gave as a reward when He saw Caleb's complete faith. Caleb received this special grace because he **"followed God wholeheartedly."** When the 10 Canaanite spies spoke words of unbelief, he and Joshua showed complete faith in God, and thus received this word of blessing from God.

Caleb waited for God's promised word for more than 45 years. And because Caleb believed that word so much, he now came before Joshua to claim the fulfillment of God's promise. We too, whether it's regarding finances, problem-solving, healing and restoration, if it's a word God has given, we must hold onto it. And now we must not just keep it in our hearts, but speak it in prayer and claim it in our lives.

✿ Application Question 1

- 1) What is one thing in my life right now that I should 'not just keep in my heart,' but hold onto God's Word, claim it, and put it into words and actions?
- 2) Let's share an experience of God through holding onto, proclaiming, and claiming the Word that God has given. (What Word am I holding onto and proclaiming this year?)

Answer 2. Obey God's Word (Verse 12)

(Joshua 14:11) **"Now give me this hill country that the LORD promised me that day. You yourself heard then that the Anakites were there and their cities were large and fortified, but, the LORD helping me, I will drive them out just as he said."**

Based on God's promised word, Caleb could have requested any good land he wanted, but what he actually requested was the hill country of Hebron. That place was rough and barren land, and it was where the descendants of Anak, the offspring of the Nephilim, an ancient race of giants, lived. This revealed that Caleb's request for Hebron was not out of personal greed or selfish desire, but showed that he stepped forward saying **"I will do it"** when everyone else was afraid. This was Caleb's declaration of obedience, dedication, and faith toward God's will.

(Joshua 14:12) **"...if the LORD is with me, I will drive them out just as the LORD said."**

This is like the promise Jesus made to His disciples as they went out with the Gospel.

(Matthew 28:20) **"teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."**

The Lord knew that the disciples would face persecution, threats, and numerous hardships. Nevertheless, He commanded them "Go and make disciples" and gave them just one promise: "I will always be with you." The disciples held onto just this one promise and spread the Gospel. As a result, they scattered and spread the Gospel throughout the known world at that time, and within a few centuries, the Gospel spread widely throughout the entire world.

Our Grace Church's GMI ministry is the same. We became a church that carries out the Lord's



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Great Commission in Matthew 28:19. From an ordinary immigrant church, lay people obeyed the command to "Go." At first, we had no mission experience, knowledge, or finances. But as we obeyed and went out, the Lord was with us as promised, and He worked personally. We are confident that the Lord who accomplished great things in the past will accomplish even greater things through us as we obey.

✿ Application Question 2

- 1) What is my 'hill country of Hebron' that the Lord is telling me to "Go" to, but I am avoiding? (Due to fear, inadequacy, possibility of rejection, cost of dedication, etc.)
- 2) What areas can I obey based solely on the 'promise of companionship' rather than visible 'results'? (Missions, evangelism, service, ministry, etc.)

Answer 3. Depend on God's Word and Go Forward

(Joshua 14:13-14) **"Then Joshua blessed Caleb son of Jephunneh and gave him Hebron as his inheritance. So Hebron has belonged to Caleb son of Jephunneh the Kenizzite ever since, because he followed the LORD, the God of Israel, wholeheartedly."**

Caleb received Joshua's blessing for what God had granted. However, reality had not changed at all. The environment remained the same, with no change in circumstances. All that was visible was only the blessing prayer of Joshua, the servant of the LORD. But Caleb did not stay put after receiving that blessing—he immediately went forward.

(Joshua 15:14-15) **"From Hebron Caleb drove out the three Anakites—Sheshai, Ahiman and Talmi, the sons of Anak. From there he marched against the people living in Debir (formerly called Kiriath Sepher)."**

When God speaks, what follows is obedience, and when obedience begins, history starts to move quietly but surely. The moment faith becomes reality is when we believe the promised word and enter the battlefield, and the time we experience God's work is when we obey depending on His Word.

Peter began to walk on water in obedience to the Lord's word **"Come."** This is impossible by common sense, experience, and knowledge. But when there is God's Word, all things are possible. Caleb finally achieved his dream with this kind of faith and became an ancestor of faith. We too should become the protagonists who inherit and enjoy the abundant blessings of God's kingdom like Caleb.

✿ Application Question 3

- 1) What area would you like to actually challenge yourself in while confessing 'When I obey, God works'?
- 2) Let's share our faith decisions to live holding onto God's Word this year and pray for each other. (Meditation, reading through the Bible, Bible study, church nurture program - starts February 11)
